Derek Major Buxton (RIP)

The Reverend Derek Major Buxton passed away peacefully at home surrounded by his wife and children on March 17 2022 in the evening. Much loved and respected, he spent his early years at Wood Leasow farm in Leigh before ordination in the Church of England. His work included University Assistant Chaplain at St Nicholas, Precentor at Leicester Cathedral, Rector of St. Deny's Ibstock, St. John the Baptist Heather, Canon at Woodhouse Eaves and Old Woodhouse, Regional Padre to the Air Training Corps and Padre to the Comms and Security Group UK at Garats Hay. A Thanksgiving Service to celebrate Derek's life and ministry will be held at St Paul's Woodhouse Eaves at 2pm on Saturday 2nd April.

Legion Elections 2022

The Board of Trustees is ultimately responsible for governing the Royal British Legion (RBL) and ensuring that it is effectively run. All Trustees are equally responsible in law for the Board's actions and decisions. Therefore, Trustees have key leadership roles. A new National Chairman, National Vice-Chairman and three Trustees are to be elected.

The RBL began the process of drawing up a shortlist of candidates back in November 2021. Candidates for the posts of Legion Chairman, Vice Chairman and those to serve as Trustees were notified in early March. Election packs have now been distributed to qualifying Branches.

The closing date for the return of ballot papers from branches is 14 April 22 and members who have been successful in the elections will take up their new roles immediately following the close of Legion Conference 2022 in May.

Those elected will serve a three-year term from May 2022. Elected Trustees may serve no more than three full and one partial term.

We held a General Branch meeting, via Zoom, on 29 March 2021 to cast our votes.

Summer Gathering 2022.

The Branch Summer Gathering for 2022 will be centered around the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire. An act of remembrance will take place at the Y Services Memorial on Saturday 23 July 2022 followed by an opportunity to explore the rest of the NMA park and a meet up for an informal lunch and socialising in the main NMA restaurant. No booking needed just turn up and meet up at the Y Services Memorial then treat yourself to an NMA lunch afterwards.
