## Motions 2022

Motion 1		
Proposer	Staple Hill and District Branch, Cheltenham Branch	
Motion	This Branch requests that the Board of Trustees and Director of Welfare provide clarification on current arrangements for Welfare breaks for beneficiaries. When the decision was taken to close Break Centres the membership was assured that beneficiaries would be able to apply for breaks as before, but that accommodation would be provided within the Private Sector. It has been our experience that the current process is not working as originally suggested and we request clarity.

	The Motion is supported by the Board of Trustees:	
BOT response	We would like to reassure members that we did not remove the facility to provide respite breaks through grants when we closed the RBL Breaks services in 2019.	
	We'd like to clarify the two types of breaks that we can award through our grants programme. These are:	
	<ol> <li>Grants for breaks for beneficiaries whose mobility or medical needs mean they cannot obtain a grant through other providers.</li> <li>Grants for short term home care so that the carer can take a break. Please note, this only applies where the applicant is not eligible for statutory provision.</li> </ol>	
	As with all grants issued by the Legion, the decision to make the award will be based upon the needs of the applicant, and their ability to meet those needs without causing themselves financial distress.	
	We have ensured that the criteria for issuing these grants are explained clearly in our grants policy documents. We have also fully briefed our contact centre and area offices so they know when it's appropriate to consider this form of assistance.	
	We hope this provides clarity – and reassurance – regarding the availability of welfare breaks through our grants programme.

Motion	That Honorary Membership of the Royal British Legion be automatically granted to any member attaining their Centenary.

BOT response	Any member attaining their centenary will be offered free membership. Based on the 2022 engagement survey two thirds of members support honorary membership and we would need to carefully consider this special status and the eligibility criteria, noting we already have lifetime membership. It will be duly considered alongside family membership as part of our future thinking; the redefined purpose and role of members and the offer which is in development.

BOT response	We recognise the need to move away from cheques & embrace alternative payment methods. At the same time, we do not allow the use of debit cards due to the risk of theft and fraud. Instead, we are working with Lloyds to introduce internet banking for those branches that wish to use it.

Proposer	Cheltenham & District Branch, Gloucester City Branch	
Motion	This Conference challenges the current policy of Head Office Finance Department in relation to its actual and planned disbursements from Area Trust Funds (ATFs) and the lack of visibility of such transactions, particularly relating to the South West Midlands (SW Mids) ATF. Finance Department should publish to branches each May, clear details of the annual income and expenditure from the relevant ATFs.

	The Motion is not supported by the Board of Trustees:	
BOT response	These meetings are long and demanding and it is important that quality time during the day is dedicated to the sessions. These same individuals are often, also giving time at the weekends for other Legion commitments. Many employers are very supportive of staff acting as volunteers & Trustees and allow time for such duties. We currently have several Trustees and MC members who also work full time.
