The Exhortation was delivered by Branch President, Col (Retd) Eric Sambell who also closed the ceremony by reciting the Kohima Epitaph. During the two minutes silence Farmer Vaughan laid a RBL wreath on the Y Services Memorial. Branch chairman Jim McDermott gave a short address and Branch Secretary John Swann read the Y Services prayer. This was without doubt quite a moving event in the memorial garden and a highlight of the weekend. Members then dispersed for lunch and to explore the NMA's many monuments and gardens.

#### **FOYSM UPDATE - Update**

As members will know, the cost of the upkeep of the Y Services Memorial at the National Memorial Arboretum (NMA) is paid from a fund the Branch established in 2021. Contributors to the fund which is called "Friends of the Y Services Memorial" (FOYSM) make regular monthly payments along with some annual payments by other individuals and a generous lump sum from the Intelligence Corps Association. To ensure that we can maintain the fund and pay the annual bill we have recently approached several associations related in some way to Y Services. To date the Royal Naval Association and the Royal Signals Association (RSA) have both indicated that they are unable to help. The RSA has. however, offered to publicise the FOYSM fund to the Corps in appropriate media and we are in the process of creating suitable promotional material for this purpose. Responses are awaited from the WRAC Association and the Royal Air Force Association.

Any members visiting the NMA and who look in on the Y Services Memorial and Garden would be doing a great service if they would take a pic and upload a comment on the condition and appearance of the site on the Branch Facebook page – Please! #### **CENOTAPH CEREMONY**

The National Service of Remembrance will be held at the Cenotaph on Whitehall in London on Sunday 13 November 2022. The Royal British Legion organises the annual Veteran March Past that passes the Cenotaph on Remembrance Sunday for 10,000 British and Commonwealth former military and civilian Service personnel. Eligibility. Participants must meet at least one of the following eligibility criteria:

• Ex-service Military and Civilian men and women from the UK and the Commonwealth that served the Crown.

• Wives, husbands or civil partners of those who died in service in Her Majesty's Armed Forces.


• A carer of a veteran requiring wheelchair assistance.

The carer accompanying the veteran must be included within the capacity. Therefore, where appropriate, the option of one veteran assisting another for the duration of the event should be considered. Members of The Royal British Legion who meet the eligibility criteria can apply to be part of the Legion contingent but are encouraged to march with their relevant Corps, Regimental or Service Association. We will continue to monitor government advice with respect to Covid-19 for mass gatherings to ensure the health and safety of our participants, which remains our priority, and update accordingly. #### **ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2022 – RESULTS OF MOTIONS**


Legion Head Office, Haig House, recently published the results of voting on motions at annual conference 2022. The motions and results are listed below. Motion 5 was not carried and is not included. The full document with Trustee responses will be made available on the Branch website.

**Motion 1** (Staple Hill and District Branch, Cheltenham Branch) This Branch requests that the Board of Trustees and Director of Welfare provide clarification on current arrangements for Welfare breaks for beneficiaries. Motion Carried

**Motion 2** (Portugal and Atlantic Islands Branch, Antwerp Branch) That Honorary Membership of the Royal British Legion be automatically granted to any member attaining their Centenary Motion Carried

**Motion 3** (Paris Branch, Somme Branch) This Conference asks the Board of Trustees to allow proxy voting for Branches at AGMs Motion Carried

**Motion 4** (Derbyshire – Chesterfield Branch, Chapel-en-le-Frith Branch) This Branch requests that, as a matter of priority, the County Conference passes this motion to the Board of Trustees for action. To implement the use of Bank debit cards, if required, by Branches who are finding difficulty in paying bills by cheque. Motion Carried





**Motion 6** (Cheltenham & District Branch, Gloucester City Branch) This Conference challenges the current policy of Head Office Finance Department in relation to its actual and planned disbursements from Area Trust Funds (ATFs) and the lack of visibility of such transactions, particularly relating to the South West Midlands (SW Mids) ATF. Finance Department should publish to branches each May, clear details of the annual income and expenditure from the relevant ATFs. Motion Carried

**Motion 7** (Cheltenham & District Branch, Staple Hill Branc) This Conference strongly urges the Board of Trustees to acknowledge the concerns of membership with the process, protocols and management adopted for this round of Elections for National Officers and Trustees. The Board is strongly encouraged to engage with, and seek recommendations from, the Membership Council, on behalf of the wider membership, and to review and revise the Election process into clear and

**Motion 8** (Wycombe Marsh Branch, Buckinghamshire County) This Conference requests the Introduction of a policy that the Board of Trustees and the Membership Council meetings be held on Saturdays and Sundays thus enabling members that have full time employment to stand for election and play a full part in these formations.
