DAVE LAWRENCE GETS A NEW BASE!

Having made do with a makeshift portable base for several years, designed and manufactured by Branch Chairman Jim McDermott, Branch Standard Bearer Dave Lawrence now has a brand new polished wooden base with a shiny brass tube. The purchase of the base was authorised by the Branch Committee at its meeting in November.

Background.

Quite frequently at events, where our Standard is on parade, it is not always easy to 'park' the Standard. Members may be fascinated to know that a cunning plan was launched some 4 years ago to create a unique piece of equipment to accommodate said Standard (and at the same time not spend any money)! Tests and calculations were made to determine the combined weight of the Standard and pole and the required weight of the base to ensure stability. This led eventually to the development of the:

Heavy Briefcase Style Standard Base Apparatus Mk 1

Dimensions are: W: 44cm, H: 12.5cm, D: 26cm

Colour: Battleship Grey

Material: Solid wood (part of an old railway sleeper)

Weight: Very heavy

The old base has served us well at venues countrywide.

THE 'Y' SERVICES MEMORIAL AT THE NMA

The Y Services Memorial at the NMA commemorates all those from WWII to the present day working in Electronic Warfare Signals Intelligence who have fallen serving their country.

A permanent tenant is still being sought




