Summer Gathering 2023

The start of the Branch Summer Gathering (SG23) on Friday 21 July 2023 coincided with low pressure over most of the UK resulting in showers, heavy showers and several downpours. However, your Branch committee braved the inclement conditions and held a committee meeting outdoors (during a break in the weather) near the main centre of attraction for the weekend, The Shoulder of Mutton pub located at Hamstell Ridware; a tiny hamlet, best described as being in the middle of nowhere but is a short journey, by road and narrow lanes, to the National Memorial Arboretum. Branch business complete, the committee, along with spouses, friends and several dogs retired to the pub. An evening barbeque was enjoyed by all and the usual telling of long and exaggerated tales continued until lights out.

On Saturday 22 July 2023, plans for a wet weather programme in the National Memorial Arboretum Chapel were ditched when heavy rain decreased to a fine drizzle and, at 1100 hrs, Branch de facto Padre John Bird, welcomed a gathering of 32 veterans and friends of the Y Services. The names of Y Service personnel killed in recent conflicts were read out and those present remembered also those who have died since retiring from the armed forces. The Branch Standard was on parade and, following the playing of the Last Post and Reveille, Branch President Eric Sambell recited the Exhortation. We were pleased to welcome Peter Cousins and Bob Sim the now adult children/relatives of former World War Two wireless operators who had worked at Beaumanor. Wreaths were laid on behalf of the Branch and JSSU (R) along with a floral tribute with photographs of Joan Thornton (nee Bradshaw) and Sybil Sim (nee Hardie) the former Beaumanor operators. Branch Chairman, Jim McDermott, in his address reflected on remembrance and spoke about the several improvements and developments to the Y Services plot which, having been laid out with a ring of sticks on a muddy field, is now a quiet and peaceful place in which to sit in quiet contemplation. After prayers, the service ended with Bill Nelson reciting the Kohima Epitaph





Our Standard Bearer, Dave Lawrence, works closely with our Branch Community Support representative (BCS) Karen Brutnell; they swing into action when notification is received that a Branch member has died. Karen sends a Branch condolence card and in the fullness of time makes contact with the deceased member's family to offer comfort and support. If the family requests it, arrangements can be made for the Branch Standard to be paraded at the funeral and, again if requested, for the coffin to be covered with an appropriate corps drape. Also, if appropriate, for a military band bugler to be in attendance.

**Colin Grazier, GC (7 May 1920 – 30 October 1942) was a sailor in the Royal Navy who was posthumously awarded the George Cross for the "outstanding bravery and steadfast devotion to duty in the face of danger" which he displayed on 30 October 1942 in action in the eastern Mediterranean when capturing codebooks vital for the breaking of the German naval "Shark" Enigma cipher from the sinking German submarine U-559.*
