

REMEMBRANCE SERVICE ST MARY-IN-THE-ELMS CHURCH, OLD WOODHOUSE, LEICESTERSHIRE, LE12 8UZ SUNDAY 12th NOVEMBER 2023



The annual Remembrance Day Service will take place at St Mary-in-the-Elms Church, Old Woodhouse, Leicestershire on Sunday 12th November 2023, commencing at 1045 hours.



During the service a collection will be taken for the Poppy Appeal. Our Branch Standard will be on parade as will a representative from MOD Garats Hay and uniformed contingents from Chicksands and JSSU(R). After the service there will be a short parade at the village war memorial for the laying of wreaths.

Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided in the village hall at the conclusion. A donation box will be placed by the door and donations will be welcome to defray the cost of these refreshments, the hire of the hall and the service from the Ladies of Woodhouse.

Personnel attending are advised to arrive by 1030 hours latest, as the Church is always very well attended on this occasion. Parking is available across from the church on the village hall grounds. Please <u>DO NOT PARK</u> outside the church entrance, as this is reserved for disabled personnel.

This year's plastic-free poppy is the first redesign of the iconic symbol of Remembrance in a generation and is the latest in a series of designs since the poppy was first used to raise funds in 1921.

The plastic-free poppy is made from 100 per cent paper and easily recycled in household collections. The innovative new poppy design features the iconic poppy shape, with a black centre embossed with 'Poppy Appeal', and a leaf with a crease. It no longer has a plastic stem or centre, and it can be fastened with a pin in the stem, worn in a buttonhole, or a stick-on version is available.

A plea for help from the Head of Establishment (HOE) and Executive OfficeR (XO) at MOD Garats Hay

The MOD Garats Hay has received a Government Tasking to support the Afghanistan Relocation and Assistance Policy (ARAP).

We have become a temporary rest stop for several Afghan families arriving to the United Kingdom before they are transported to their settled accommodation across the country. Families will be flown into the United Kingdom and bused to MOD Garats Hay from arrival airports. The aim of this is to give them the opportunity to rest and recuperate from their long and potentially stressful journey before being moved on to their final destinations. Defence has assigned a team of military personnel to ensure that the families will be well looked after during their short stay.

We expect to have multiple families pass through the facility over the coming months and will aim to have no more than around 300 residents on site at any one time. Once this temporary tasking is completed, MOD Garats Hay will revert to being a Training and Conferencing facility for Defence. We hope that this will not have too great an impact on the local community, however you might well see the families out and about locally. They will all have visas to live and work in this country and are free to come and go as they please.

We owe a debt of gratitude to Afghans who risked their lives working alongside UK forces in Afghanistan and we feel privileged to be able to support the ARAP scheme by providing a welcome base for them upon their arrival in the United Kingdom.

These families will have very little when they arrive, and it would be wonderful if we were able to give the children some toys to play with. These can be dropped off on Remembrance Sunday at St Mary in the Elms and the church will make sure that we get them.


